## Places

University or Uni
Ex: Which uni was she at?

College
(US) a university where you can study for an undergraduate(= first) degree
EX : to go to college [,^ndə'grædjvit]
(UK) University division (faculté)

## Degrees

## Bachelor's degrees or undergraduate courses

BA (Bachelor of Arts) : 3 years
$\rightarrow$ a first university degree(= qualification) in the arts or social sciences, or someone who has this degree Ex : She has a BA in History from the University of Sussex.

BSc (Bachelor of Science) : 3 years
$\rightarrow$ a first-level university degree in science
Ex: a BSc in geology/chemistry/biology

It takes four years to get a bachelor's degree in the US, on more year than in England.

In America, the first year of a degree is known as the Freshman year, the second as the Sophomore year, the third as the Junior year and the final year as the Senior year.

## Postgraduate Courses

MA (Master of Arts) : 1 year
$\rightarrow$ an advanced college or university degree in a subject such as literature, language, history, or social science, or a person who has this degree
Ex: He has an MA in linguistics

MSc (Master of Science) : 1 year
$\rightarrow$ an advanced college or university degree in a scientific subject, or a person who has this degree EX : She has/is doing/is studying for an MSc in biochemistry.

PHD (Doctor of philosophy) : 3 years
$\rightarrow$ the highest college or university degree, or someone who has this
EX: He has a PhD in Italian literature.
She's a PhD.

## Words and expressions to remember

To sit (for) an exam/ To take an exam
To pass an exam $\neq$ to fail an exam
An undergraduate (a student who is studying for their first degree at a college or university)
A graduate (a person who has a first degree from a university or college)
A postgraduate (étudiant de troisième cycle)
